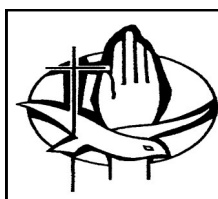
## Fabio's News

### Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity:



One God in three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

On the Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit have the same

nature, the same divinity, the same eternity, the same power, the same perfection, in a few words we can say, they are one God and there is perfect communion between them.

Each time we make the sign of the Cross, we remember the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity.

**In the name of the Father:** we put our hands on our foreheads, pointing to the brain that controls our whole body, remembering that God is the source of life.

**And of the Son:** we place the hand between the chest and the abdomen near the heart, remembering that for love of us Jesus Christ incarnated, died and resurrected to free us from sin.

**And of the Holy Spirit:** we place the hand on the left shoulder and then on the right; remembering that it helps us to carry the weight of our life and at the same time it enlightens us.
